Flood situation improves in Bongaigaon district

BONGAIGAON, Aug 23: The flood situation in Bongaigaon district has improved since Friday. But erosion by the rivers is on with falling water levels in the district.

Hit by erosion, around 300 families along the Aie river in North Salmara in the district had to take shelter on the roads on Saturday.

Crops like paddy, jute, sugarcane and vegetables have been damaged by flood in North Salmara subdivision, which is considered as a hub of agri-produce and

milk. Hence the crisis of vegetables and cow milk has been noticed in the markets.

As the flood water have snapped the connecting roads between Lengtisinga and Rangapani in the district, people from either side have to negotiate the distance by boats, local residents informed.

However, if the breached dams and embankments besides Aie river are not repaired in time, the next flood is likely to cause havoc in villages beside the river, local residents apprehended.

In Chirang district also, the flood situation is improving. But erosion by rivers

has not stopped yet in some villages in the district. The flood affected many farmers in the district by damaging crops, vegetables, fisheries and dairy farms.

Dr Bhumidhar Barman, State Revenue Minister and Basanta Das, Water Resource Minister, visited Kokrajhar and Chirang districts respectively to review the flood situation and had a meeting with the district administration for follow-up action.

Dr Bhumidhar Barman told mediapersons that his Government is not getting the financial support needed to tackle the flood situation in the State.

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CM conducts aerial survey

Flood toll goes up to 13

GUWAHATI, Aug 23: Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi today made an aerial survey of flood-affected Lower Assam's Kokrajhar, Chirang, Bongaigaon, Goalpara and Dhubri districts even as the death toll in the current deluge rose to 13.

Accompanied by Chief Secretary VK Pipersenia and other senior officials, which included Commissioner and Secretary, Revenue and Disaster Management and CEO, Assam State Disaster Management Authority, PK Tiwari, Chief Minister Gogoi made an aerial survey of the worst-affected districts of Lower Assam on an Indian Air Force chopper.

Landing at Narengi Army helipad after almost two hours of aerial survey, Chief Minister Gogoi said the State Government has geared up rescue and relief operations in the flood-affected areas. Gogoi praised the NDRF and the SDRF for the all-out efforts in rescuing marooned people. The Chief Minister said the ministers and officials have fanned out to the affected areas and are monitoring the relief operations.

The Chief Minister said the Central Government is yet to release a sizeable chunk of funds sought by the State Government for infrastructure damages caused by floods last year. It has only released Rs 380 crore so far. "We have

submitted memoranda to the Central Government, including the Prime Minister and Home Minister, but have not received the funds sought by us for huge infrastructure damage caused by floods last year," he said.

Gogoi said there are no funds constraints in providing relief to the affected. "We have funds for relief work. What we require from the Central Government is sufficient funds for building up the infrastructure such as roads, bridges, school buildings, health centres, dwelling houses and embankments damaged by floods last year and proper rehabilitation of the flood-hit people," he said.

It may be mentioned that Chief Minister Gogoi, in a memorandum to Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh in Guwahati on October 1 last year, sought Rs 2,010 crore for damaged infrastructure, which included roads and bridges, dwelling houses, health centres and school buildings. It also demanded Rs 660 crore for rescue and relief opera-

tions. Besides, a sum of Rs 6,700 crore was sought as special assistance to the State, which included Rs 3,500 crore for raising and strengthening of embankments and Rs 1,000 crore for mitigating the flood problems of Guwahati city.

The Chief Minister said the first priority of the Government is to provide relief to the flood-hit people, and that he has instructed the Deputy Commissioners of the affected districts to leave no stone unturned to extend all possible help to the affected, especially children and women. "Restoration of surface communication and repair of breached embankments have also been accorded priorities," the Chief Minister added.

Gogoi said that the Government would prepare an assessment report, highlighting the damage and rebuilding exercise only after the flood waters recede.

Coming soon: early flood warning system

Chennai Corporation will develop an early flood warning system for the city to cope with challenges associated with the north east monsoon. A team of officials will visit Mumbai and cities in Telangana to study the early flood warning system shortly.

Once the system is commissioned, issuing early flood warning will be possible to prevent loss of lives and property

along the Cooum, Adyar, Kosasthalaiyar or the Buckingham Canal.

More than 7 lakh buildings are estimated to be located in areas prone to flooding along waterbodies.

A decision on commissioning Real Time Decision Support System may also be taken after a study by Anna University.

The hydrology project is also expected to allow the civic body forecast likely rainfall in the catchment area, enabling it to

warn line agencies to take measures and avert human and property loss by regulation of release of excess water.

Currently, there is always a danger of flooding in downstream areas of waterways and in 130 waterbodies as the city does not have any system to forecast how much water will flow in each neighbourhood.

"With the help of the new system, we may be able to issue warning in advance to take measures in downstream areas

when water is released," an official said.

Decision on installing data acquisition system stations comprising automatic rain gauge, automatic climate stations and water level recorders in the catchment areas may be taken based on advice by Anna University.

"Chennai has topography

with a different gradient when compared to other cities. The early flood warning system should be developed after studying the drainage system and developing a mechanism to drain the water. Interconnecting waterbodies will be crucial. It is yet to be done," said N.Mathavan, a disaster management expert.

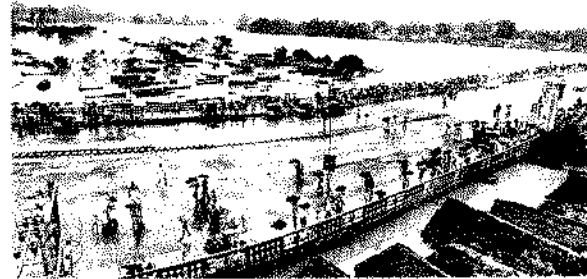


Can WhatsApp, Twitter galvanise volunteers into action?

CHENNAI: Due to unavoidably sluggish flow of information, the entire scale of destruction in the October 1943 Madras floods, arguably the worst the city has ever experienced, became evident only after the floodwaters had subsided.

Heavy rainfall between October 4 and 10 led to dangerous breaches in the embankments of major rivers and lakes, including Cooum and Adyar, but a complete picture of the damage emerged only as late as October 14. Whatever followed was fire-fighting, which was hardly effective in most cases. For example, it was learnt later that Perambur was one of the worst-affected

localities, with eight people being swept away by the furious waters.

Experts say that today, when technology often gives slowly developing calamities the character of an unfolding drama, being caught un-

awares is unpardonable. "In a flood, social media, including Twitter and WhatsApp, provides the option of responding quickly to emergencies as they arise. However, effective technological intervention is contingent on

effective use of this technology. It also entails mobilisation of volunteers and having a plan much ahead of the event," says Professor R.R. Krishnamurthy, head of the department, applied geology, Madras University.

"A street-wise emergency map has to be created. Vulnerable streets have to be identified. Houses with senior citizens should be identified too. In the Climate Disaster Resilience Index that the Madras University prepared, together with the Chennai Corporation and the Kyoto University, this is exactly what we did: identify two wards that were vulnerable to floods. We arrived at a street-wise emergency plan for these wards," explains Prof. Krishnamurthy.

It was a theoretical model. To make it workable, volunteering groups should be brought on board. These groups should provide contact details - obviously one that includes their Twitter handles - of those of its members who live in these flood-prone areas. When these areas face a flood crisis, these volunteers can be informed about the situation immediately and people can be bailed out of danger.

There is a lesson from another flood. The heart-rending image of two people crushed to death in their Maruti 800 in Mogappair defines the 2005 flood for us.

"It should not take a flood to show us that a tree is weak. Smartphones and responsible citizens should be able to

do that much before harm befalls anyone. NGOs should teach citizens the signs of decay they should look for in a tree. The citizens can in turn identify weak trees in their neighbourhood, take pictures of them and mail them to the Corporation, which could take proactive action," says Shobha Menon, trustee-founder, Nizhal.

Experts say in the event of a flood, residents of each neighbourhood should know the safest route to the nearest building that is not prone to flooding. Each of the two hundred wards should have volunteers who would assist residents, especially women and children and senior citizens. And, needless to say, the entire process could be facilitated by technology.

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Sand mining endangers new bridge in Srikakulam

SRIKAKULAM: Unabated illegal sand mining is posing a threat to the bridge being constructed on the Nagavali river as apprehensions are rife that the excess excavation from the nearby ramp will be a blow to the strength of the structure that will ensure connectivity between old and new Srikakulam.

Around one lakh people living in Gujaratipeta, PN Colony and the 20 villages nearby have been facing problems in reaching the core areas of Srikakulam after the old bridge was dismantled three years ago to make way for the new one. They now fear that the new bridge would not serve the purpose if its strength is com-

promised owing to the illegal sand extraction.

Recently, the government opened a sand ramp in Hayatnagar, near where the bridge is coming up, and it has proved a

gold mine for sand transporters. Sand with estimated value of more than Rs.1 crore is being lifted every day from the ramp, which is very close to the National Highway 16. Further, of late

illegal sand mining has become rampant, allegedly because of a nexus between government officials and transporters.

The local people of Hayatnagar recently took to the streets alleging that sand was being transported illegally for the reach by lorries and tractors in the night to which officials were turning a blind eye.

Probe demanded

Leading the protest, YSRC leader Dharmana Prasada Rao demanded a thorough probe into the allegations and steps for the protection of new bridge.

"Illegal mining continues un-

abated from near the bridge in violation of the Water, Land Tree Act-2002 which says that sand excavation must not be undertaken near the bridge as it would lead to the collapse of the structure owing to lack of strength," YSRC leader Gumma Nagesh told *The Hindu*. What is the use of spending crores of rupees on the works, if the govt. fails to protect it? he asked.

Asked about the malpractice, Srikakulam Collector P. Lakshmi Narasimham said that the issue would be referred to the Roads and Buildings Department and a field inspection would be conducted soon.

Assam wants Rs 500-cr flood package from Govt

GUWAHATI, DHNS: Assam government has asked the Centre for Rs 500 crore assistance for relief, rehabilitation and repair works following the massive floods that claimed 14 lives and stranded 8.33 lakh people.

Despite the stoppage of torrential rains, flood situation in the state showed little signs of abating as major rivers flew over danger mark and inundated more dry land.

"We will seek Rs 500 crore as an interim relief from the Centre. Many areas are still under water, so the final assessment of damages will take some time," Assam Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi said in a press conference in state capital Dispur. "As soon as the water level goes down, we will start assessing the damages of

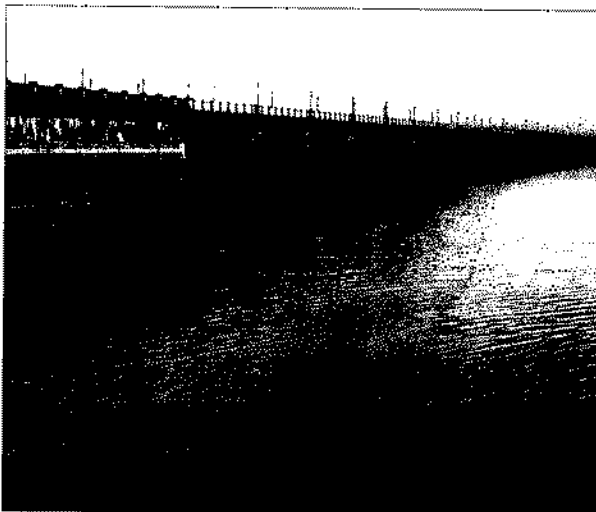

Drastic drop in generation at Sharavathi, Linganamakki hydel plants likely

SHIVAMOGGA: As predicted by the India Meteorological Department (IMD), it has been a weak monsoon so far in the Malnad region. The district has not received copious rains in August, the third month of the rainy season, so far. It is likely to have an adverse impact on electricity generation at the Sharavathi Hydro Electric project, the backbone of the state's power generation.

According to Sharavathi chief engineer (electrical) Shivaji, the plant generates 5,000 million units (MU) of power per annum. It is feared that there would be a shortfall of around 3,000 MU this year, if there is no drastic rise in water

level of Linganamakki dam in the coming days. The plant contributes 23 per cent of the

power generated in the State. It generates 10 to 11 MU of power per day. The Sharavathi

power station, with its 10 units, has an installed capacity of 1,035 MW and the powerhouse at the Linganamakki reservoir, with two units, has an installed capacity of 55 MW.

According to the dam authorities, the water level was at 1,787 feet against the maximum level of 1,819 feet on August 24. Interestingly, the water level was 1814.50 feet on the same day last year. This figure clearly indicates that the dam is unlikely to reach its maximum level in the remaining days of the rainy season as it is still short of 32 feet. Had the water level crossed 1,800 feet, it should have been possible. But now, the possibilities of the dam reaching the brim are less, they said.

They said that they could generate power from the Ma-

hatma Gandhi, Sharavathi, Linganamakki and Gerusoppa power plants only for 90 days, if the government demands for maximum capacity power generation. A total power of 22 MU could be generated from these plants per day. But 9,000 cusecs of water has to be used for the purpose.

Speaking to *Deccan Herald* over the phone, Sharavathi Hydro Power Station chief engineer (electrical) Shivaji said, "We have not received any direction from the government on reducing or stopping power generation in the plant. The purchase of power from other states and utilisation of power generated from other sources of energy are necessary as the dam is unlikely to reach its maximum level this year."

SALEM: Water release from the Mettur dam was stepped up to 13,502 cusecs on Tuesday.

The release was reduced by 3,000 cusecs (from 13,500 cusecs to 10,500 cusecs) on Sunday owing to widespread of rainfall in the Cauvery delta districts where samba cultivation is in progress.

As the rainfall stopped in the delta region, the release

was stepped up on Tuesday.

The dam continued to receive good inflow owing to rainfall in the catchment of the Cauvery in Karnataka.

21,030 cusecs

The dam received 21,030 cusecs on Tuesday and water level rose to 93.08 feet against its full level of 120 feet. The storage too improved to 56.21 tmc ft against the full capacity of 93.470 tmc ft, PWD sources said.

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Encroachments along 27km of Yamuna to be removed

New Delhi: The Delhi government and the Centre have decided that encroachments along 27km of the Yamuna banks will be removed to make space for riverfront development. Chief minister Arvind Kejriwal met Union water resources minister Uma Bharti, transport minister Nitin Gadkari and urban development minister, M Venkaiah Naidu on Wednesday to discuss plans for a special purpose vehicle (SPV) for reviving Yamuna. Delhi ministers Kapil Mishra and Satyendar Jain were also present.

It was also agreed that a six-member committee headed by the secretary, ministry of

water resources, will be set up to study various options for cleaning of the 49km stretch of Yamuna flowing through Delhi and neighbouring states.

According to a note by the ministry of urban development, Kejriwal suggested that cleaning of Yamuna could be

taken up without the government spending on it and that it can even generate surplus revenue instead. He said that land on both sides of the river over a 27km stretch is with the Delhi government. DDA and the Delhi government would take the responsibility of clearing the encroachments on it.

Naidu suggested forma-

tion of a committee of secretaries of various ministries and Delhi government departments for examining various options and submitting a report on feasible options. The committee will submit its report by September, 2015.

At the meeting, Gadkari has discussed the waterways project that can be implemented to make Yamuna navigable. Tourism and water minister Mishra tweeted, "Great to see Naidu, Gadkari and Uma Bharti/i listen to us. We hope they help us transform Delhi."

TOI had reported on August 13 that SPV will function on the lines of the Delhi Metro and will singularly carry out and monitor development of the river and riverfront.

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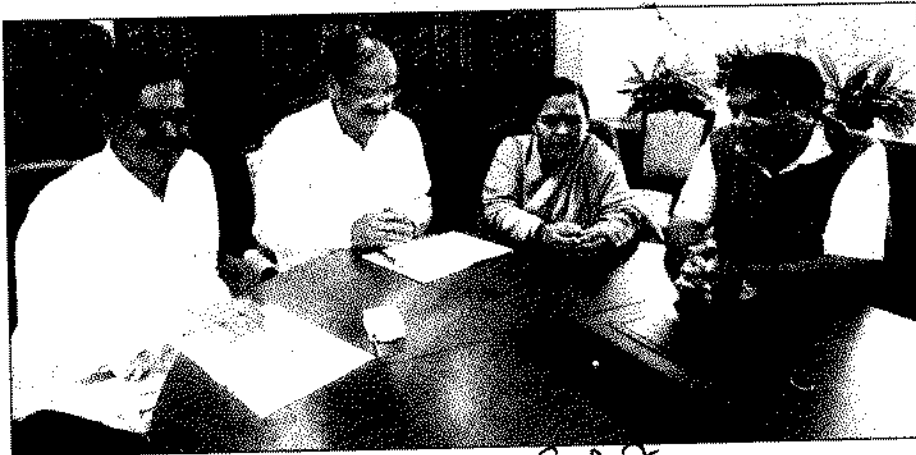

MAKING IT A TOURIST HUB ON THE LINES OF INDIA GATE DISCUSSED

Clean Yamuna: panel to submit report by Sept. 30

The success of the Delhi Metro rail project, it was decided at a Centre-Delhi government meet on Wednesday, would likely be replicated to clean up the Yamuna in the Capital, make it a hub for tourism, and address the drinking water woes of people.

A six-member committee comprising officials from the Union Ministries of Water Resources, Urban Development, Surface Transport, and Environment; the Delhi Development Authority (DDA); and several others departments under the Delhi government has been constituted to prepare a report by September 30.

The decision to form the committee, which would formulate a roadmap for cleaning the river, was taken at a meeting attended by Union Ministers M. Venkaiah Naidu, Uma Bharti, Nitin Gadkari, and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. Mr. Kejriwal had sought the participation of Mr. Gadkari and Mr. Naidu for the purpose at an interaction with Ms. Bharti earlier this month.

"The committee will be formed under the chairmanship of the Water Resources Ministry secre-

tary and it has been given a mandate to study various aspects, including a suggestion to have a special purpose vehicle, because the suggestion is that it can be on the model of the Delhi Metro, where the State and the Centre join hands," Mr. Naidu told reporters after the meeting.

"Already the DDA has made some proposals. The Water Resources Ministry too has come up with its proposals... They will come up with a final report," the Union Urban Development Min-

ister said.

Noting that the possibility of inland transport across the Yamuna would be explored to facilitate cargo movement, Mr. Naidu said that issues such as utilising recycled water, beautification of river banks, and providing clean water for Delhiites were discussed.

The Minister said that they were looking at making the river a tourist attraction on the lines of India Gate. Delhi Tourism Minister Kapil Mishra said that the is-

sue of harvesting rainwater and floodwater in the Yamuna was also discussed at the meeting.

Mr. Kejriwal and Ms. Bharti had, on August 8, agreed to set up a special purpose vehicle for the cleaning and rejuvenation of the river in line with which it had been agreed to prepare a blueprint in the next 45 days.

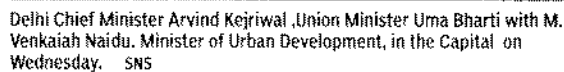

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Six-member panel set up to clean Yamuna ^{27/8}_{ST}

The committee will submit report next month

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 26

A six-member committee has been set up to study various options for cleaning the 49-km stretch of the Yamuna flowing through Delhi. The decision was taken at a meeting chaired by the Minister of Urban Development M. Venkaiah Naidu today.

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal accompanied by PWD Minister Satyendra Jain and Delhi Jal Board Chairman Kapil Misra, Union Water Resources Minister Uma Bharati and Surface Transport and Shipping Minister Nitin Gadkari and senior offi-

cials from respective departments attended the meeting, sources said.

Various options, including formation of a special purpose vehicle for undertaking the work of cleaning the river, were discussed.

According to the sources, Kejriwal suggested that cleaning the Yamuna could be taken up even without the government's spending anything on the task. He said that land on both the sides of river over a 27-km stretch is with the Delhi Government and the rest with the DDA while the Delhi Government would clear the encroachments.

After discussions, Naidu suggested formation of a committee to examine various options and submitting a report on it which was accepted by all.

The six-member committee to be headed by the Secretary (Water Resources), Union government, will include representatives of the Ministries of Urban Development, Water Resources, Surface Transport, Environment besides those of the Delhi Government.

The committee will submit its report in September for further consideration by the governments of India and Delhi.

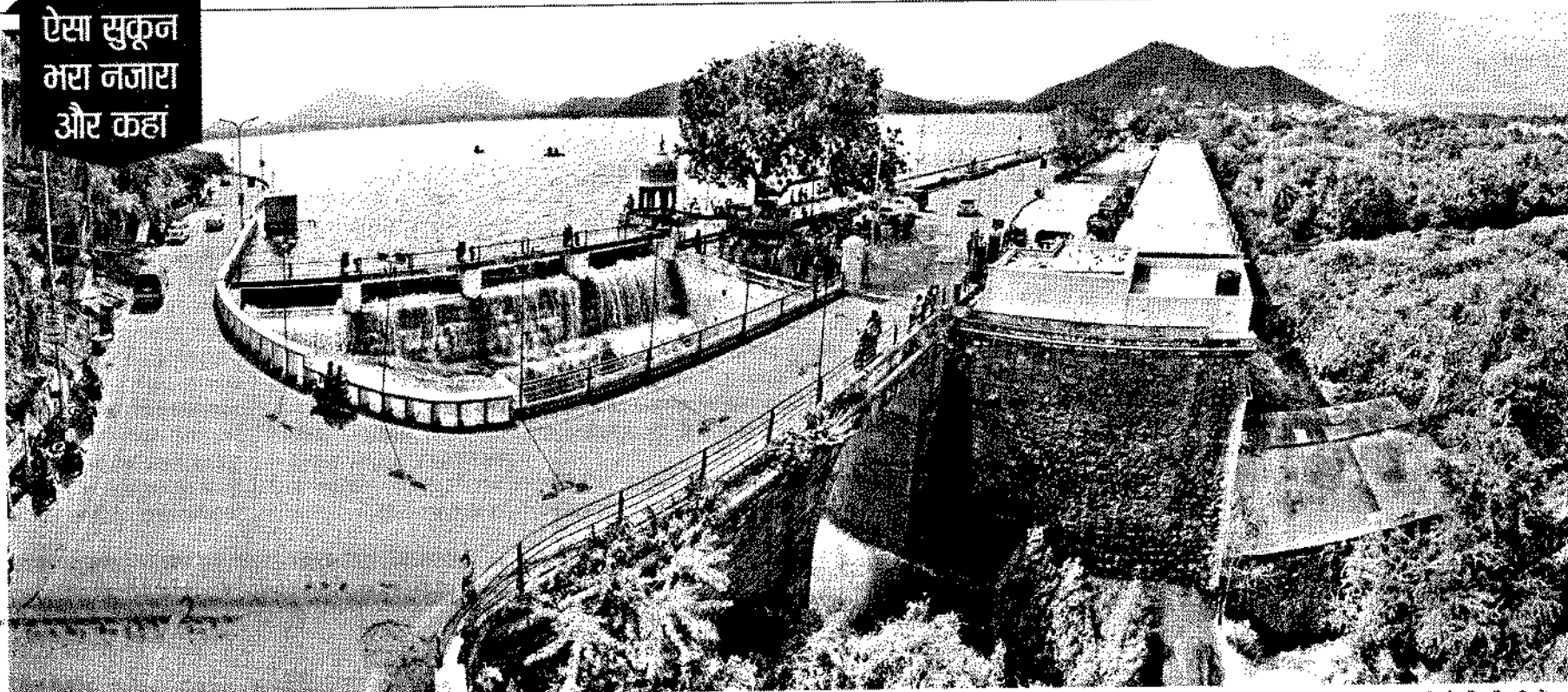

हैं। इसी कवायद में सिंगापुर के वैज्ञानिकों ने एक ऐसा रोवर तैयार किया है, जो मंगल की बेहद ठंडी सतह से पानी निकालने और उसे जमा करने का महत्वपूर्ण काम करेगा।

सिंगापुर यूनिवर्सिटी ऑफ टेक्नोलॉजी एंड डिजाइन और ऑस्ट्रेलिया की गिलमोर स्पेस टेक्नोलॉजी ने मिलकर रोवर के इस प्रोटोटाइप को तैयार किया है। वैज्ञानिकों ने इसे मार्स एक्वा रिट्राइवल सिस्टम (मार्स)

नाम दिया है। वैज्ञानिकों ने केवल 10 हजार डॉलर के बजट में मार्स को तैयार किया है, जो अभी मंगल के तापमान और दबाव की 30 फीसदी तक की परिस्थितियों को सह सकता है। परीक्षणों के बाद यह मंगल की परिस्थितियों में पूरी तरह काम करने में सक्षम रोवर की शक्ल लेगा। लाल ग्रह पर गए क्यूरियोसिटी, फोनिक्स मार्स लैंडर जैसे कई रोवरों ने वहां पानी होने के संकेत दिए हैं।

कॉर्पोरेशन यमुना के अंदर छोटें जहाज चलाने की भी शुरुआत करेगा। योजना तो यह भी है कि दिल्ली से आगरा तक छोटें शिप के जरिए जाया जा सके। उधर, यमुना में साफ पानी के लिए दिल्ली जल बोर्ड इंटरसेक्टर एंड डायवर्जन स्कीम पर काम कर रहा है। इस स्कीम के तहत यमुना में गिरने वाले तीन बड़े नालें- नजफगढ़ ड्रेन, शाहदरा ड्रेन व सफ़िलमेंट्री ड्रेन के साथ-साथ पाइपलाइन बिछाकर गंदे पानी को सीधे सीवेज ट्रीटमेंट प्लांट तक ले जाया जाएगा। प्लांट में पानी साफ करके इसे फिर से नालों के जरिए यमुना में छोड़ा जाएगा, ताकि यमुना में साफ पानी के साथ-साथ बहाव भी बना रहे।
